

Certificate III in Carpentry provides a trade outcome in carpentry, covering work in residential and commercial application. You will learn the basic foundations and content to develop the skills and knowledge used in the building and construction industry to efficiently produce quality work. You will carry out setting out, construct wall frames, ceiling frames, pitched roofs, eaves, external stairs, flooring systems, install windows and doors.

This qualification has replaced CPC30211 Certificate III in Carpentry as of 27 November 2022.

A transition period applies to enable current students to complete their study. The transition period finishes on 26 November 2022.

If required, enrolments will be transitioned into the replacement qualification.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This qualification is delivered under the Australian Apprenticeship Program. Students must be employed in an apprenticeship to undertake this qualification. Applicants must be minimum age of 13 years old.

DELIVERY MODES

Workplace Delivery – State-wide (QLD). Workplace delivery with regular site visits by your trainer and assessor. Some off the job delivery may be scheduled as required to assess skills that are not able to be demonstrated in your workplace.

College/Block Delivery

3-4 Days Block Release with Site Visits by your Trainer and Assessor.

11 Blocks are scheduled throughout the duration of the apprenticeship for theory and practical training at our purpose built Trade Training Centre.

DURATION

Nominal term of this Apprenticeship is 48 months, the expected duration is 42 months. This apprenticeship can be offered full time, part time and school-based.

FEES AND FUNDING

The User Choice program provides a public funding contribution towards the cost of training and assessment services for eligible Queensland apprentices and trainees. User Choice is funded by the Queensland Government.

Apprentices undertaking training under the User Choice program are required to contribute to the cost of their training through a set student contribution fee of \$1.60 per nominal hour for each unit of competence. This fee may be paid on the apprentice's behalf by an employer or another third party. In most instances under the award, employers are responsible for paying tuition fees.

Qualification Overview

To achieve this qualification, the student must demonstrate competency in 34 units of competency - 27 core units and 7 elective units. Recognised Prior Learning (RPL) recognises your existing experience gained through life or work for which you may not have obtained a formal qualification. RPL is suitable for experienced individuals with no formal qualifications. We will work with you to identify your existing skills and knowledge and assess if you can then achieve a full or part qualification which will save time and avoid unnecessary duplication of training. RPL and Recognition of Current Competencies (RCC) may be available for this qualification.
