

Certificate III in Cabinet Making and Timber Technology

MSF30322

This qualification provides a Trade outcome in Cabinet Making and Timber Technology, covering work in residential and commercial applications. Installation skills may be applied to new or renovation work. You will learn the basic foundation and content to develop the skills and knowledge used to manufacture and fit furniture typically in a kitchen or bathroom. You will also learn about safe work practices and about the context of the building industry. Occupation titles may include Cabinet Maker (Kitchen and Bathrooms) and Furniture Maker.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must be a minimum age of 13 years old. This qualification is delivered under the Australian Apprenticeship Program. Students must be employed in an apprenticeship to undertake this training program. School-based students not enrolled in years 10, 11 or 12 may be eligible to enter a school based apprenticeship provided there are exceptional circumstances warranting consideration and all other entry requirements are met, including being of an age where it is legal to undertake paid employment.

As a general rule, only Australian citizens and New Zealand citizens who have entered Australia on a valid passport have unrestricted rights to employment in Australia. Visa holders may engage in apprenticeships or traineeships provided their work rights allows this, based on information and advice provided by the Department of Immigration and Border Protection.

Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) to be supplied by each apprentice (Protective footwear, long sleeve shirt, safety glasses and hearing protection) as well as a calculator, pen and paper.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

To achieve this qualification you must demonstrate competency in 25 units of competency - 8 core units plus 17 elective units.

DELIVERY MODES

Workplace delivery with regular site visits by your trainer and assessor. Some off the job delivery may be scheduled as required to assess skills that are not able to be demonstrated in your workplace.

DURATION

Nominal term of this Apprenticeship is 48 months, the expected duration is 42 months. This apprenticeship can be offered full time, part time and school-based. Casual is not permitted in Queensland.

COURSE FEES

This qualification is delivered under the Australian Apprenticeship Program. Students must be employed in an apprenticeship to undertake this training program. Eligible students may be able to access a range of independent and government funding such as User Choice Funding or Fee Free Training for year 12 graduates, to help subsidise the cost of training. Please contact the RTO at Skill360 Australia to discuss the available funding options.

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Fees & Funding

The User Choice Program provides a public funding contribution towards the cost of training and assessment services for eligible Queensland apprentices and trainees. User Choice is funded by the Queensland Government.

Apprentices undertaking training under the User Choice program are required to contribute to the cost of their training through a set student contribution fee of \$1.60 per nominal hour for each unit of competence. This fee may be paid on the apprentice's behalf by an employer or another third party. In most instances under the award, employers are responsible for paying tuition fees.

Some apprentices may be eligible for concession. Please check with our website or contact our office for more information.

Recognised Prior Learning (RPL)

RPL recognises your existing experience gained through life or work for which you may not have obtained a formal qualification. RPL is suitable for experienced individuals with no formal qualifications. We will work with you to identify evidence of your existing skills and knowledge and assess if you can then achieve a full or part qualification which will save time and avoid unnecessary duplication of training. RPL and Recognition of Current Competencies (RCC) may be available for this qualification.
